SPRING PROGRAMMING AT THE PARK

As we move from winter into spring, Jack London Park Partners is looking forward to a new season of programs and offerings at Jack London State Historic Park. With opportunities to explore the trails, learn about the Park's natural beauty, and gather with the community, there is plenty to look forward to in the months ahead.



To kick off the season, visitors can follow the Park's social media to discover the beautiful wildflowers and blooms throughout the Park. This series was created thanks to the dedication of a JLPP volunteer and naturalist, whose time on the trails and deep knowledge of local flora brought the project to life. These informative posts make it easy for visitors to identify and appreciate the stunning wildflowers that brighten the Park's landscapes throughout the year.

For those eager to explore the trails at a faster pace, the Park will also host its first-ever trail running event, organized by Enviro-Sports. Participants can choose between a half marathon and a 5-mile run, with both routes starting and finishing in Beauty Ranch. The course winds through oak woodlands, redwood groves, and the scenic slopes of Sonoma Mountain, offering runners a chance to challenge themselves while experiencing the landscapes London loved.



For a day of community celebration, visitors are invited to the Park's annual Call of the Wild Festival, taking place Sunday, May 17 at Beauty Ranch. This FREE family-friendly event features live music, great food, and a variety of activities for all ages. It's a wonderful opportunity to enjoy the Park in spring and connect with the community.

TRAP TRAIL TEMPORARY BRIDGE

Starting at the Historic Orchard and climbing all the way to the Sonoma Ridge Trail, Trap Trail is a beautiful and challenging multi-use trail that traverses through redwood and fir forests, along beautiful streams and past amazing vistas. However, for many years access has been limited due to a washout of the trail at Mill Creek. Issues at this creek crossing started during severe storms in the mid 2000's, and several repair attempts over the years failed in following storms. JLPP has been working with California State Parks on a permanent solution to the problem (which likely will come with a much needed trail restoration), but in the meantime we have found a temporary solution to re-open access to horses and emergency/maintenance off road vehicles.

An equestrian/pedestrian bridge was recently removed from a trail in Annadel (replaced by a vehicle bridge) and State Parks let us borrow the bridge for Trap Trail until a permanent solution can be found. This bridge will greatly improve our ability to maintain the trail, help with emergency access and eliminates a dangerous and challenging creek crossing at the old washout. A very special thanks to Mike Nelson, the Road and Trails Chief of the State Parks Bay Area District, along with other district staff for lending us the bridge, and to Nils Derickson, retired CALFIRE equipment operator, for helping us transport and place the bridge over the creek. We look forward to seeing everyone out on the trail!

RUTAS Y AVENTURAS

A Tour of the Historical Homes and a glimpse of the Casa de Lobo

We've kicked the year off with two introspective walks among the historical homes of the Londons. And even though these were the coldest months of the year, over 30 participants signed up!

January began with a 2 ½ hour guided tour of both the House of Happy Walls and the London's Cottage, called "Una Ruta por los Museos". Participants were able to get a fully interpretive walkthrough of each of the buildings and their respective artifacts, completely in Spanish. The tour revolved around Jack's life as an adventurer, a writer, and a farmer. Charmian and Jack's relationship was a running theme throughout, with Charmian's own life and accomplishments being given the spotlight in the House of Happy Walls. Overall, our participants left with a colorful picture of Jack and Charmian's life that unwittingly prepared them for February's "Caminata por la Mañana".

Continuing along the thread of historic homes in the park, February's program focused on the most enigmatic structure, la Casa de Lobo (the Wolf House). As we walked, we reviewed the main talking points of Jack's life with those that had joined us in January and used those conversations to set a foundational understanding of the Londons' life for our first time visitors. The reveal of the Wolf House is always an amazing experience for our guests, made even better by the fresh new overlook which our outstanding operations team spent all of January renewing.

With winter in full swing, we were lucky enough to pick a dry day between the rainstorms for both of these programs. The weather allowed us to talk about how water travels from the creeks on Sonoma Mountain to eventually empty into San Pablo Bay via Sonoma Creek.

Rutas y Aventuras is pausing during the month of March to focus the interpretive team's energy on our 7th grade Education Program. We look forward to welcoming our Spanish speaking community back in April with a day full of history, nature, and food followed by a multi-day program in collaboration with Sugarloaf Ridge State Park! More details will become available as the date gets closer.

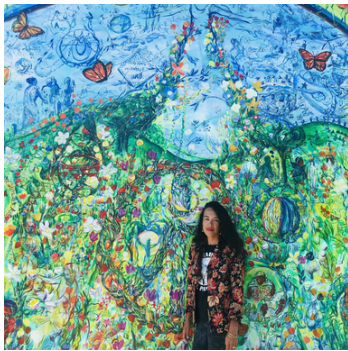

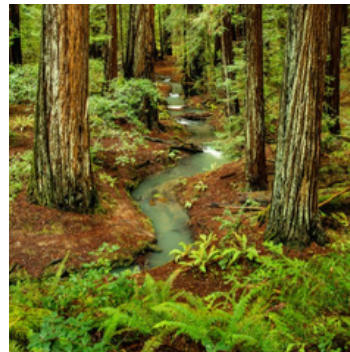
