1876-91

- San Francisco, Oakland, Livermore, Benicia, **California**

1892



Rode on the roof of a train from Sacramento over the Sierra Nevada Mountains to Reno.

1893



January 20, 1893 – August 26, 1893 - sailed on seal-hunting vessel, *Sophie Sutherland*, to Japan.

1894



April 6, 1894 – fall of 1894 tramped/hoboed across U.S. to East Coast then up to Canada, across Canada to West, down to Seattle and took ship back to CA.

1904



January 7, 1904 – June 1904 - Jack was a war correspondent covering the Russo-Japanese conflict over Manchuria.

- Chemulpo, Seoul, Kunsan, Sunan, Ping Yang (Pyongyang), Wiju, **Korea**
- Antung, Feng-Wang-Cheng, **Manchuria**

1905-1908

Lecture tour takes him to several places already mentioned, NY, IA, Ill, Missouri – but also Indiana, Ohio, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maine, North Dakota².

Jack calls off Snark voyage while in Australia on **December 8, 1908**; they leave Australia on April 8, 1909, on ship for Ecuador, then Panama, New Orleans, LA, train to Oakland and then home to Glen Ellen on July 24, 1909.

March 2 – July 26, 1912 - Dirigo sailing adventure from Baltimore around Cape Horn to Seattle.
